2nd grade lunch 11:40-12:20

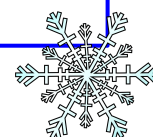
3rd grade lunch 12:20-1:00

Headphone Replacement



We want to inform you about the essential role of Chromebooks in your child's daily learning activities at our technology centers, especially during testing sessions. These devices are crucial for accessing educational materials and assessments that contribute to your child's academic growth.

To enhance their learning experience, we require students to have a pair of headphones for individual use with the Chromebooks. Headphones play a significant role in ensuring a focused and distraction-free learning environment for your child and their peers. Each classroom provides a pair of school issued headphones. Parents may opt to send headphones for their child to use instead of the school headphones.

We understand that accidents can occur, leading to headphone damage. In line with our school policy, we have a replacement fee of \$5.00 for damaged headphones. This fee helps cover the costs associated with maintaining and replacing essential equipment to ensure the continued availability of technology resources for all students.

While we recognize that accidents are unavoidable, we kindly request that replacement fees be paid promptly if your child damages the school-issued headphones. This will enable us to maintain a well-equipped and conducive learning environment for all students.
